Breaking the 4th Wall of Climate Migration was begun as a collaborative education initiative between TGP, Anywaa Survival Organization, and SOM-ACT. The project aims to: shed light on the devastating consequences of climate change on communities in the Horn of Africa in Scottish classrooms; help Somalilander and Anuak storytellers tell their own stories to a global audience; raise critical public awareness of how stories are told and

Our team is carrying out a comprehensive review of reading lists for IR courses at St Andrews, to ensure that academia recognises its colonial history and the need to create an educational system that is truly reflective of the realities of the international system beyond a western-centric lens.

After finalizing our research approach and methodology, our team launched our first set of focus groups with undergraduate students and recent graduates of St Andrews in September and October of 2020. We are now scheduling our next round of focus groups, which will begin in February.

Ali will also be presenting 'Whitewashed' to the Staff Council to familiarize faculty with the project and increase recruitment. We anticipate providing staff and students with an update on preliminary findings during a new speaker series that will launch early in the new year.

We recently collaborated with the Highland One World Centre and developed a remote-learning-friendly Climate Justice Unit for S6 English classes.

We have also just received a £15,000 grant from the Scottish University Insight Institute to explore and develop climate justice education programming that focuses on racial justice, just transitions, and climate anxiety, with academic and community-based partners including Score Scotland, Learning for Sustainability, Teach for the Future, Glasgow Caledonian Uni's Climate Justice Centre and Moray House at Edinburgh Uni.

Aamusnaan Maya (meaning 'no more silence' in Somali) Initiative (AMI) was initially a research project to identify the drivers of displacement and document the pressing socio-economic needs of displaced Somalilanders in Digaale Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camp outside Hargeisa, Somaliland. A report is currently being drafted from research conducted by SOM-ACT in August and Transparency Solutions in September. The report shows an effectiveness of Somalilander civil society in responding quickly to the pandemic and coordinating governmental and non-governmental responses. However, residents of IDP camps were largely overlooked by national and international responses.

The report is due to come out at the end of December

Emerging Researchers

Programme

The Emerging Researchers Programme (ERP) is an intensive course in critical, ethical and collaborative theory, methodology and practise, designed for students with a strong interest in climate justice, critical theory, and who intend to continue to postgraduate education and/or enter into research/policy-oriented careers.

Applications opened in November for the next cohort of Emerging Researchers, and interviews were held at beginning of December. We look
